Tain Sheriff Court and Justice of the Peace Court is located on High Street. The building is a traditional stone built detached structure within the town centre.


Ways of getting to the Court Building



By Bus

The main bus station in Tain is just a 1 minute walk from the court building.

The nearest bus stop is located on Lamington Street approximately 2 minute walk from the court building.

The entrance to the Sheriff Clerk's public counter is located on High Street and is a slightly ramped access suitable for wheelchair users.

The double entrance doors are manually operated however may be difficult from a wheelchair without assistance.

Witnesses and customers at the public counter must use this entrance.



The entrance to the Court room is via the clock tower doorway. There are a series of steps from street level.

Within clock tower entrance the staircase leads to the first floor where the Court room is located. There is no lift facility to the first floor level from this entrance.



Those attending Court hearings will enter by the clock tower door and proceed to the Court room until the case is called.

Facilities



Toilets

Public toilets are available on ground and first levels of the court. There is an accessible toilet on the ground floor.



Signage

High contrast signage is provided around all circulation areas to ensure the public zones are easily navigated.



Refreshments

There are a number of hotels, restaurants and coffee shops within walking distance of the court house.

Hearing Loop

For people who are hard of hearing a fixed loop induction service is available at all reception counters. Portable mobile loop induction services are available for all courtrooms.



On arrival please inform the reception desk staff if you require this facility.

Courtrooms

The main court is well lit and has good acoustic qualities including full induction loop facilities. Seating area is not very spacious and it does not provide a good access for all users.

Internal Access

Other than the two doors mentioned earlier, there is no other internal access within the building for the public.



Disabled access to the courtroom is available by special arrangements and is guided through the building. There is a lift soley for this purpose serving the first floor from the Public Counter entrance hall.

Witness Rooms

The two witness rooms located on the first floor are not accessible to wheelchair users as they are accessed by a short of flight of steps.

Fines and Criminal Office

This is locate within the Sheriff Court public counter.




Sheriff Clerk's Public Counter

The Sheriff Clerk's office is located on the ground floor to the left of the main entrance. General enquiries can be made here and also payment of fines.


An induction loop facility is provided for the hard of hearing.

There is a good amount of space is provided in door sizing and the width of corridors for wheelchairs to manoeuvre freely in. However powered doors are not fitted presently and assistance may be needed to open these doors.
