## **Court Dress in the Outer House**

- 1. This Practice Note has effect from 1 December 2019.
- 2. Judges sitting in the Outer House will, ordinarily, no longer wear wigs and judicial robes, except when presiding over a hearing which involves the testimony of witnesses. It is not expected that counsel or solicitors with rights of audience appearing in the Outer House will wear wigs or gowns.
- 3. If a judge determines that special circumstances exist which make it appropriate to wear a wig and judicial robe, that will be intimated to practitioners in advance of the hearing.
- 4. Practitioners are expected to wear clothing appropriate for business at all hearings.
