On behalf of the Society of Editors Scotland, I would like to thank you for sending the above consultation paper for comment. I consider the proposals to be a very positive step, however do not consider that their implementation would affect the work of journalists or newspapers in Scotland. It is obviously important that journalists can retain the same rights of access to court material as they have at present. It does not appear that the proposals set out in your paper will alter the current position. Indeed, it may be that access to relevant court documentation may be made easier.
