

**INQUIRY HELD UNDER THE FATAL ACCIDENTS AND SUDDEN DEATHS INQUIRY (SCOTLAND) ACT
INTO THE SUDDEN DEATH OF ROBERT WATSON**

DETERMINATION by RITA EMILIA ANNA RAE, Queen's Counsel, Sheriff of the Sheriffdom of Glasgow and Strathkelvin following an Inquiry held at Glasgow on the TWENTIETH and TWENTY-FIRST days of February Two Thousand and six into the death of ROBERT WATSON, aged 59.

GLASGOW, 21 February 2006

The Sheriff, having considered all the evidence adduced, DETERMINES: In terms of the Fatal Accidents and Sudden Deaths Inquiry (Scotland) Act 1976 Section 6(1)

(a) That Robert Watson, born on 1 October 1945, died on 24 August 2005 within the Royal Infirmary, Glasgow at 1320 hours.

(b) That on 21 August 2005 at North Bardowie Farm, Baldarnock, at or about 1030 hours Robert Watson, was engaged in his occupation as a self employed farmer. While mounting or dismounting a Tractor Mr. Watson fell. He suffered a fracture to his left tibia. He was admitted to Glasgow Royal Infirmary to repair said fracture and underwent surgery on 22 August 2005. He died at said Hospital on 24 August at or about 1320 hours. The cause of death was Pulmonary thromboembolism due to leg vein thrombosis due to a fracture of the left tibia following a fall from a tractor.
